The pledge of allegiance to the flag was given.

Most Illustrious Grand Master Lewis J. Blackwell was introduced and greeted.

The minutes of the previous meeting (May 3, 1986) were read and approved as read. The Treasurer reported a balance of \$2,208.84 in the Money Market account. A motion was made, seconded, and passed that the Treasurer's report be received subject to audit.

A moment of silent prayer was observed in memory of Past Governor Samuel A. Kisa, who died October 18, 1986.

Gov. Scanlett stated that the degree would be conferred in full form on May 2, 1987, with Sections 1-3 by the officers and Section 2 by a degree team with no rituals in use.

A motion was made, seconded and passed that the College sponsor coffee and soups for the Grand Council Sessions on March 14, 1987.

V.E. Grand Governor Law reported on the Annual Meeting of the Sovereign College in Calgary. A recommended set of uniform By-Laws was adopted for all Colleges to use with provisions for life membership. There were 173 members of the Purple Cross Class, but none from Delaware. The next Annual Meeting will be held in Maine in 1987.

Gov. Scarlott read a paper by Past Grand Chaplain Archer about the Churches investigating Masonry. Knight Rosevich reported that the paper presented a "poor lecture" and that there were problems.

Regrets were received from Robert Rinehart, Harry M. Sullivan, Jr., and Richard E. Wise.

A short recess was declared until the arrival of the M.W.B.W. Frank A. Battaglia.



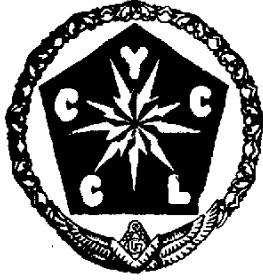
